CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION

3.4 Providing Digital Literacy in 3 govt schools of Bettiah - West Champaran through installation of computers

IMPLEMENTING AGENCY:

Akhand Jyoti Foundation



PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Skill and Digital Literacy Project, led by the Akhand Jyoti Foundation in partnership with IRCON International Limited, targets rural areas of West Champaran, Bihar. This initiative aims to bridge the digital divide by establishing computer labs, training teachers, and imparting essential skills such as Microsoft Office applications and internet usage to students in three government schools. Additionally, the project includes career counselling sessions to guide students in exploring academic pathways and career opportunities. The goal is to empower marginalised communities, particularly youth and rural women, by enhancing their digital literacy and equipping them with vital skills for future success.





Learning to operate computers and mastering software like MS Office and internet usage significantly improved digital literacy.

Substantial increases in the understanding of computers were reported, indicating effective learning outcomes.



Nearly all participants (98.4%) felt positively impacted by the introduction of new digital learning equipment.

Career counselling sessions equipped students with clarity on academic pathways and career opportunities, empowering them to make informed decisions about their future.



The programs led to a substantial rise in student engagement and academic performance, evidenced by heightened interest in learning and participation in educational activities.

3.6 Eye checkup camps and spectacle distribution at Kaushambi District of UP

IMPLEMENTING AGENCY:

Shri Ganesh Deen Shiksha Samiti

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Shri Ganesh Deen Shiksha Samiti (SCDSS), with support from IRCON International, organised 10 eye checkup camps and spectacle distribution camps across the Kaushambi district in Uttar Pradesh. The program aimed to improve health services for rural and underserved communities. These camps provided free eye checkups, distributed medicines, and spectacles, and referred serious cases to nearby hospitals. 3,037 people participated in camps, with 1,000 spectacles distributed to those in need. The initiative focused on early detection and prevention of eye diseases, raising awareness about eye health, and reducing avoidable blindness.
