पुलिस ने बताया कि 11 अक्तूबर को जिम्मेदार है और दोनों ने मिल कर पावर शराब के आदी आरोपी प्रमोद उर्फ बाबू ने अपनी दुकान बंद की और शराब पीने लगा। उसने पास में बैठी एक लड़की को देखा।

मानसिक रूप से अस्वस्थ ओडीशा की एक महिला के साथ सामूहिक बलात्कार के आरोप में तीन लोगों को गिरफ्तार किया है। दस अक्तूबर को कथित सामूहिक बलात्कार के बाद पीड़िता का दिल्ली के एम्स में उपचार किया जा रहा है। वह अपने परिवार को बताए बिना नौ मई को दिल्ली आ गई थी जिसके बाद परिवार ने पुरी में उसकी गुमशुदगी की शिकायत दर्ज कराई थी।

दिल्ली नगर निगम (एमसीडी) ने दिल्लीवासियों की सुविधा व प्रक्रिया को आसान बनाने के लिए संपत्तिकर संग्रह को अधिक पारदर्शी और कुशल बनाने के लिए एक पोर्टल तैयार किया है। एमसीडी ने एक ऐसी प्रणाली लागू की है जो डीएमसी अधिनियम (संशोधन) 2003 के अनुसार धारा 175, 123ए व बी, 123डी, 154, 156(1), 446, 152ए और मूल्यांकन आदेशों के तहत सभी नोटिसों को इलेक्ट्रानिक रूप से जारी करने की अनुमति देती है। करदाता अब इन नोटिसों को डिजिटल रूप से प्राप्त कर सकते हैं और अपनी प्रतिक्रियाएं आनलाइन जमा कर सकते हैं। इतना ही नहीं लोगों को जागरूक करने के लिए एमसीडी ने एक यूट्यूब चैनल भी बनाया है।

पांच हजार रिश्वत लेते दिल्ली पुलिस की महिला उपनिरीक्षक गिरफ्तार

नई दिल्ली, 7 नवंबर (संवाददाता)।

दिल्ली पुलिस सर्तकता यूनिट ने बवाना थाना में तैनात दिल्ली पुलिस की एक सब इंस्पेक्टर को पाँच हजार रिश्वत लेते गिरफ्तार किया है। पजा चौहान बलात्कार के एक मामले में आरोपी को जमानत दिलाने में सहयोग के नाम पर रिश्वत लेते रंगेहाथ पकड़ी गई।

सर्तकता विभाग के मुताबिक छह नवंबर को शिकायत में पीड़ित ने बताया कि उसके पति के खिलाफ बलात्कार का मामला दर्ज है। पजा इस मामले में जांच अधिकारी है। उसके पति की जमानत की अर्जी पर पांच नवंबर को दिल्ली के एक अदालत में सुनवाई होनी थी। पुलिस अधिकारी पूजा ने आरोपी पर दबाब बनाया कि अगर शिकायतकर्ता ने उसे कुछ पैसे दें दिए तो फिर उसके पति की जमानत नहीं हो पाएगी। पजा ने एक अधिवक्ता से भी जमानत दिलाने के नाम पर मिलने कही और जब पीड़ित मिले तो उससे डेढ़ लाख रुपए मांगा गया। पीड़ित ने जब पैसे देने में असमर्थता व्यक्त की तो फिर उससे पचास हजार और पाद में बीस रुपए में सौदा तय हो गया। दस हजार रुपए उसने दे दिया लेकिन पुजा बार-बार अन्य रकम की व्यवस्था करने के लिए दबाब देने लगी। उसने सर्तकता विभाग में शिकायत देकर पजा को पकडवाने के लिए साथ दिया और फिर रिश्वत की रकम के साथ उसे गिरफ्तार करवा दिया।

उपन्यास 'द सैटेनिक वर्सेज' पर प्रतिबंध के खिलाफ याचिका का निस्तारण

जनसत्ता संवाददाता नई दिल्ली, 7 नवंबर।

दिल्ली उच्च न्यायालय ने 1988 में सलमान रुश्दी के विवादास्पद उपन्यास 'द सैटेनिक वर्सेज' के आयात पर प्रतिबंध लगाने के तत्कालीन राजीव गांधी सरकार के फैसले को चुनौती देने वाली याचिका का निस्तारण कर दिया। न्यायालय ने कहा कि चूंकि अधिकारी संबंधित अधिसूचना पेश करने में विफल रहे हैं, इसलिए यह माना जाना चाहिए कि वह मौजूद ही नहीं है। अपने आदेश में न्यायमूर्ति रेखा पल्ली की अध्यक्षता वाली पीठ ने कहा कि याचिका, जो 2019 से लंबित थी, इसलिए निष्फल थी और याचिकाकर्ता कानून में उपलब्ध पुस्तक के संबंध में सभी कार्रवाई करने का हकदार होगा।।

याचिकाकर्ता संदीपन खान ने अदालत में तर्क दिया था कि वह पुस्तक का आयात करने में असमर्थ हैं, क्योंकि पांच अक्तूबर 1988 को केंद्रीय अप्रत्यक्ष कर एवं सीमा शुल्क बोर्ड द्वारा एक अधिसूचना जारी की गई थी, जिसमें सीमा शुल्क अधिनियम के अनुसार देश में इसके आयात पर प्रतिबंध लगा दिया गया था, लेकिन यह अधिसूचना न तो किसी आधिकारिक वेबसाइट पर उपलब्ध थी और न ही किसी संबंधित प्राधिकारी के पास थी। अदालत ने कहा कि परिस्थितियों के मद्देनजर, हमारे पास यह मानने के अलावा कोई अन्य विकल्प नहीं है कि ऐसी कोई अधिसूचना मौजूद नहीं है, और इसलिए, हम इसकी वैधता की जांच नहीं कर सकते और रिट याचिका को निष्फल मानकर उसका निपटारा करते हैं।

Ruckus in J&K House: Some MLAs bring another 'tougher' special status resolution

BASHAARAT MASOOD SRINAGAR, NOVEMBER 7

A DAY after the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly passed a resolution moved by the Omar Abdullah government seeking dialogue for restoration of J&K's special status, five non-BJP Opposition MLAs submitted a resolution to the Speaker that "unequivocally" rejected the decisions of August 5, 2019.

Unlike Wednesday when most of the non-BJP Opposition parties supported the government resolution, with riders, the MLAs attacked the ruling NC, hinting that it had an understanding with the Centre.

The five legislators – People's Conference's Sajad Lone, Peoples Democratic Party's Waheed Para and Fayaz Mir, and Independent MLAs Sheikh Khursheed Ahmad and Shabir Ahmad Kullay - said their 'People's Resolution', which mentioned the contentious Articles 370 and 35 A, stemmed from public anger over the one moved by the Omar government.

AMIDSTASHARP fall in incidents of firm fire this season, the environment ministry has doubled the penalty for stubble burning in the national capital region to ₹5,000 for those with land holding of less than two acres and to ₹10,000 for those having land between two and five acres. Farmers with land of more than five acres will pay an environmental compensation of ₹30,000 as against earlier ₹15,000.

The environment ministry announced amendments to the rules concerning the imposition,

collection and utilisation of environmental compensation for stubble burning. Over the past several days, the region has witnessed a thick layer of smog, while the overall air quality continued to remain in the 'very poor' category. On Thursday, Delhi's average air quality index (AQI) was at 377 at 4 PM.

There has been a 58% decline in burning of paddy straw during September 15-November 6 in six northern states. Punjab has so far recorded a 74% drop in stubble burning incidents in 2024 as compared to the same period last year, while neighbouring Haryana has seen a 44% drop.
